

## **INTERREG IVA**

### **Monthly Progress Report to Programme Monitoring Committee 31 May 2009**

#### **1.0 Introduction**

It was agreed at the meeting of the INTERREG IVA Programme Monitoring Committee, 22 October 2008, that monthly progress reports would be provided to members. This is the sixth of these reports and is for the period up to 31 May 2009.

#### **2.0 Overview of Progress**

A total of 73 applications have been received for the INTERREG IVA Programme. Three tenders under the Creative Industries call have been received this month. To date, a total of eleven Steering Committees have taken place, recommending a total of 33 projects for approval to the value of €153.4million. As a result of this activity, a total of 17 Letters of Offer (LOO) have been issued.

#### **3.0 Progress on Implementation**

##### **3.1 Priority 1 Theme 1 – Enterprise**

The position remains as:

A total of 10 projects with a value of €31,460,230 have been recommended for approval by Steering Committee against a budget of €70,000,000. Nine Letters of Offer have been issued to date under this theme.

Table 1 below outlines the status of ten projects that have been recommended for approval by Steering Committee in Priority 1, Theme 1 by 31 May 2009.

It should be noted that variations in amounts reflect negotiations that have occurred between the time of Steering Committee recommendation and issue of Letter of Offer.

### 3.2 Priority 1 Theme 2 - Tourism

The position remains as:

A total of seven projects with a value of €28,512,885 have been recommended for approval by Steering Committee against a budget of €30,000,000. Two Letters of Offer have been issued to date under this theme, to ICBAN and COMET.

### 3.3 Priority 2 Theme 1 – Collaboration

A total of twelve projects with a value of €53,201,903 have been recommended for approval by Steering Committee against a budget of €65,000,000. Three Letters of Offer (Putting Patients First, the Department of Health, Social Services and Public Safety (DHSSPS) (NI) and Ireland / Northern Ireland Cross Border Co-operation Observatory, Centre for Cross Border Studies and Small Ferries Strategic Plan, (CMAL Scotland) have been issued.

## 5.0 Payments Issued to date

To date, the Central Payments Unit of SEUPB has issued payments to projects, as of 31 May 2009, for £909,425.84 and €3,156,994.40. These include advance payments to projects which still need to be vouched and verified in order to become expenditure.

## 6.0 Summary

As of 31 May 2009, 33 applications have been approved through Steering Committees. The value of those approved applications total €153.4million. To date, 17 Letters of Offer have been issued to successful Lead Partners to the value of €104,148,995.
