The project proposes to build a shared and open city by sustaining institutions which are deemed to be fair and accessible to all, are committed to change through dialogue, and in which every citizen knows that they are represented and can participate. They anticipated doing this by training and testing new models of community engagement, such as encouraging staff to engage in the training programmes and develop and test new models of community engagement. By training staff members, the council indicated this would enable staff members to positively manage good relations and provide a civic leadership role within and outside of their workplace.

The lead partner set two main objectives, one was to complete a Diversity Audit: Within Council and two other organisations: to baseline their current culture and Two, to provide Training for Trainers on good relations and social cohesion, migrant worker awareness; these courses may include elements of the following Mediation and Conflict Management, Intercultural Competence, Prejudice Awareness, and Challenging Racism and Sectarianism. The Council would employ a Neighbourhood Engagement Officer to coordinate this process of engagement and to ensure that all groups are represented in this process, including minorities.

Reason for Rejection

The project meets overarching objectives of the Programme, building on their pilot inter-agency dialogue project "the Conflict Transformation Learning Consortium". The project's proposed activities are geared towards establishing and improving good relations with the training element being a huge element of programme (community representatives, agency staff and elected members).

The project was considered to be useful to build foundations to engage with each other, however this proposal was considered to be weak in terms of other PEACE training programmes developed. The main focus was on dialogue.

Overall, a general lack of focus on peace and reconciliation was demonstrated throughout the application. The link with the PEACE III Programme and the key theme was not sufficiently evidenced.</p>

The concept had merit as it aimed to target many of the groups and areas documented within the Peace III Operational Plan.</p> <p>The application fails to make the connection between the activity (which is sparsely described) and the impact of that activity on cross-community relations, understanding and reconciliation.</p> <p>The application failed in this aspect as there was a general lack of detail; this included other aspects of the proposal, including the budget and work plan, this resulted in a score well below the quality threshold.</p>
