
#### **PEACEPLUS: Context**



### Shared Education Act 2016

#### Education together of:

(a) those of different religious belief, including reasonable numbers of both Protestant and Roman Catholic children or young persons; **and** 

(b) those who are experiencing socio-economic deprivation and those who are not,


which is secured by the working together and co-operation of two or more relevant providers.

The legislation states that relevant providers of shared education are any which provide educational benefit to children or young persons, including youth services.





"to provide direct, sustained contact between children from all backgrounds through collaboration between and within schools, early years settings and youth organisations, to promote good relations and enhance children's skills to contribute to a cohesive society."



# What does Shared Learning Together Education Programme (Non-Formal) seek to achieve?

The non-formal education together of those from diverse communities.

Youth to youth Shared Learning Together programmes delivered by youth organisations, which are co-designed by young people and youth workers. Such non-formal programming should incorporate cultural awareness activities and opportunity for significant and sustained contact; including the development of cross border exchange programmes.

#### How?


Projects should be delivered by youth organisations, which facilitate youth-based organisation partnership on a cross-community and or cross-border basis.

- young people whose learning experience can be enhanced through additional supports;



### **Shared Learning Together Education Programme** (Non-Formal)

### **Scope and Range**

Projects must encompass all actions and demonstrate a regional based partnership or consortium, ensuring delivery across Northern Ireland and Border Region, and which has the competence to deliver to all target groups (youth organisations) and deliver all of the output indicators sought within this call. It is envisaged that proposals will also look to address local issues of strategic importance to the region.

# Shared Learning Together Education Programme (Non-Formal) Measuring Change




# HOW TO BUILD A STRONG PROPOSAL




#### Other things to bear in mind

- Take this time to build your partnership: be clear on who is doing what; build a framework for communications;
- Speak to other potential applicants; complement; share good practice.
- Don't bite off more than you can chew: can you really deliver on this scale?
- Think about finance: can you manage the cash flows?
- Have clarity of purpose; your project, but it must have a lasersharp focus on peace-building, positive relations
- Think about how you are going to monitor your targets.
