Donegal County Council in partnership with Fermanagh District Council and ADoPT (Association for the Development of Pettigo & Tullyhommon) is currently undertaking a major regeneration project in the villages of Pettigo and Tullyhommon funded by the EU's PEACE III Programme.

The Termon Project is a multifaceted physical and recreational regeneration project designed to enhance the twin villages of Pettigo in County Donegal and Tullyhommon in County Fermanagh, using the River Termon as a focus for creation of shared public spaces for use by all communities.

The new Riverside Walkway and new footbridge across the river Termon will provide a restful and symbolic feature in the centre of the village, uniting both villages across the border.

The building works will also include the

construction of a multi-purpose venue of 22,000 sq. ft, a new playgroup building and a youth hub at the local Methodist hall. It will provide a range of modern purpose designed facilities for all groups in the wider community.

Contractors P.J. Treacy & Sons Ltd have been appointed to undertake all the works under this complex scheme, with the project being managed by Donegal County Council along with project partners Fermanagh District Council and the Association for the Development of Pettigo and Tullyhommon (ADOPT).

Upon completion, the scheme will deliver a major revitalisation of the area and the provision of cross-community facilities in the border villages of Pettigo and Tullyhommon, on the Donegal/ Fermanagh border.

### Key project outputs:

- A new village gateway linking a public riverside park on the Tullyhommon bank of the river and the riverfront picnic area in the Pettigo side.
- A 4m wide footbridge to span over the water and join the communities.
- The core project will be located at the current community centre site in Pettigo and the Methodist Hall in Tullyhommon. This element of the project will incorporate the redesign of the community hall, toilets, Methodist Hall, recycling space, horticultural tunnels, car park,
