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CHILDREN AND YOUNG PEOPLE (£707,632.09):

This part of the Action Plan will include: a good relation programmes for both primary and post primary schools, a youth sports programme and an open call grants programme for constituted community groups.

Key Output: Number of participants aged 0-24 completing approved programmes that develop their soft skills and a respect for diversity: 1,420

SHARED SPACES AND SERVICES (£1,247,683.06):

This part of the Action Plan will create new shared civic spaces that will be used by all sections of the community. Projects will be of a sufficient scale to have a transformative effect on local areas, as well as having a regional significance.

Key Output: Local initiatives that facilitate the sustained usage on a shared basis of public areas/buildings: 1

BUILDING POSITIVE RELATIONS (£1,383,963.80):

This part of the Action Plan will include an urban and migrant communities programme; a rural communities programme; a shared space arts and events programme; a cross-border shared heritage programme and a cross-border literary trail.
